Over the coming weeks we will be adding some new outdoor furniture to the courtyard and pupils will be given access to this area during interval and lunchtime.



## **Subject spotlight - English attainment**

The Department of English would like to congratulate our young people on their commendable achievements in the National Qualifications last session (2017-18).

The department is keen to offer National 5 and Higher English courses to as many of our learners as possible and so our entries for these courses are high. Last session 124 learners in S4 were entered for the National 5 English qualification (which is 73.6% of the S4 roll) and we are pleased to report that 87.3% of these candidates attained a pass, with 71% achieving a grade A or B. Furthermore, 25 pupils in S5 and S6 also attained National 5 English at grade A-C.

Learners attaining a National 5 English qualification in either S4 or S5 have now been welcomed into Higher English classes for this new session. We are also pleased that 51 of our Senior Phase learners attained a National 4 English qualification last session, which means these successful candidates are now encouraged to go for National 5 English this year. We wish all our Senior Phase learners the best of luck as they begin their efforts towards the next step in their English qualifications, and we will work hard to support all our learners through what, no doubt, will be for them a very busy academic year.

The department of English is also very pleased and proud of the hard efforts and well deserved successes of learners who sat Higher English last session. The number of candidates in S5 and S6 sitting Higher English was 121, and we are happy to report that 76.9% of these candidates achieved a pass at grade A-C. We are now delighted to find that quite a good number of these young people now feel encouraged to hone their knowledge of language and literature by working towards an Advanced Higher English qualification this session.... we wish them well!

After School Higher/N5 Opportunities

We have had great success previously with our after school Highers/N5 programme. This allows pupils to study for an additional qualification in certain subject areas outside the school day either over one or two evenings a week from 3.30pm-5.00pm. Courses on offer this session will be:

**Higher Sociology** 

Higher Health and Food Technology

N5 Maths

If anyone is interested in studying Higher Sociology they should attend a taster session on Monday 3rd September where you can hear more about what the course entails and how you will be assessed. This will be held in U16 at 3.30pm. If you are interested in studying Higher Health and Food Technology you should attend a taster session in the Health and Food Department on Monday at 3.30pm. If you are interested in N5 Maths please speak with Mr Conway to see if this would be a suitable pathway for you.

Results in these classes have previously been excellent and as a school we have had great success in allowing our pupils the opportunity to widen their curriculum as well as pick up additional qualifications for university and college.
