## **Curriculum spotlight - S1 Creative Technologies**

Within the DMG Department pupils have been developing their Computer Aided Design/Computer Aided Manufacturing (CAD/CAM) skills over the last few weeks. Pupils have individually created their own card model of a Christmas t-light holder before transferring their designs on Autodesk Inventor (3D Modelling Program) and finally having them manufactured using the Laser Cutter. So far in Creative Technologies we have enjoyed making tea light holders in different shapes. We drew our template design onto card. We could chose a Christmas themed idea, some of us made snowmen some of us made them Christmas trees. When we finished making them on card we put our designs on the computer and then the teacher printed them on the laser cutter. It was really good fun to see our designs go from card to computer and then to see our own designs being printed on the laser.
