Duke of Edinburgh

A new Duke of Edinburgh group started this year at St Margaret's. We currently have 60 pupils from across S3-S6 involved in the program working towards their Bronze and Silver Awards. The groups meet most Friday afternoons and have been learning lots of practical skills such as navigation, first aid, cooking on camp stoves and putting up tents. This term the sessions will focus on planning the routes for their expeditions.

To achieve an award pupils complete 2 expeditions but also have to spend time volunteering, doing a sport and developing a skill. Pupils have been involved in a huge variety of activities ranging from babysitting to boxing, from dancing to debating. They've been a credit to the school and we're receiving many positive comments from their supervisors.



SUNDAY 27 JANUARY 2019

Third Sunday of the Year - Year C



Today we begin the consecutive reading of Luke's Gospel, which was originally joined to Luke's other work, the Acts of the Apostles. The way the story is told prepares us for what happens in Acts.

Today's Gospel shows Jesus proclaiming the word of God in the synagogue at Nazareth. From the scroll of Isaiah he selected the passage that contained the prophet's

messianic vision of pardon, healing and liberation (61:1-2). Then he declared that this marvellous prophecy was being fulfilled among them (in and through his ministry).

Jesus was sent, not to the wealthy or the powerful, but to the poor and the lowly, the oppressed and the suffering. Here we see Luke's concern for the poor and the afflicted. Who are the poor? In the first place, the poor are those who live on bread alone and who never hear the Word of God. But the poor are also the dispossessed of this world, those who are waiting for liberation. The good news must not be limited to spiritual blessings only.

On 22 January we celebrated the feast of St Vincent

Pallotti. This Roman diocesan priest (1795 – 1850) created the Society of the Catholic Apostolate - an international community of priests and brothers. His name is the reason for the popular name "Pallottines". The official Latin name is

Societas Apostolatus Catholici and SAC, the abbreviation used by the Pallottines, stems from the first letters of this name.

The Society is part of the Union of the Catholic Apostolate founded in 1835. Currently, the Society counts 2,300 members, who live in more than 300 local communities in all continents and in more than 40 countries. The Pallottines are ranked 17th in the world of religious communities for men and are the 3rd biggest order in Poland.

The members, priests and brothers, bind themselves to the Society by the promises of chastity, poverty, obedience, perseverance, the sharing of resources and the spirit of service. The basic motto of the Society is the words of St Paul "the love of Christ urges us" (2 Cor 5,14). Mary, Queen of Apostles, is the Patroness of the Society.

The SAC has a hierarchical structure at three levels. The supreme administrative organ is the General Administration with its office in Rome. The second level is constituted of the 12 Provinces and 8 Regions. At the third level we have Local Communities throughout the world and there are around 300 of them. Some are small (in Scotland there are currently 7 Pallottines), and others have lareger numbers (in India there are over 200 novices and students and in Oltarzew/Warsaw, Poland we have together 80 community members).

The SAC started as an Italian order which quickly became international with the largest number of German and Polish members in the 20th century. In recent years, there has been a growing number of Indian, African and South American Pallottines. We co-operate with the Pallottine Sisters and with many thousands of lay people forming the Union of the Catholic Apostolate (UAC).

WIADOMOŚCI POLSKIEJ WSPÓLNOTY W LIVINSTON



Drodzy, usłyszeliśmy w dzisiejszej Ewangelii, że Jezus rozwinął księgę i znalazł miejsce, gdzie było napisane: "Duch Pański spoczywa na Mnie, ponieważ Mnie namaścił i posłał Mnie, abym ubogim niósł dobrą nowinę, więźniom głosił wolność, a niewidomym przejrzenie". Naśladując Mistrza z Nazaretu przez wieki całe rzesze świętych kobiet i mężczyzn czuło duchowe powołanie do wyznaczenia szczególnej drogi duchowego rozwoju w Kościele, tworząc różne wspólnoty. Ponad 150 lat temu św. Wincenty Pallotti (1795-1850) zwrócił uwagę na naglącą konieczność ożywienia wiary i rozpalenia miłości wśród katolików, aby doprowadzić w ten sposób wszystkich ludzi do jedności w wierze Chrystusowej. Uważał, że dla osiągnięcia tego celu niezbędne jest pozyskanie duchownych i świeckich, oraz że dla pełniejszego wykonania apostolskich zadań Kościoła należy zjednoczyć ich wysiłki.(Prawo SAC, Wprowadzenie)

W prezencie dla Was, którzy współpracujecie z Pallotynami zachęcam do obejrzenia wywiadu z ks. Stanisławem Stawickim SAC. Po co świętować Uroczystość Pallottiego? Czego nie wiemy o Don Vincenzo?
