## Pathways programme 2019

Over the coming weeks, our S2-S5 pupils will be making their course choices for next session. In order to best support our young people in making these choices we have put together a comprehensive support programme which includes a number of parent information sessions and the launch of a new online resource including course information materials and case studies.

#### **Key dates**

- S3 course choice day 20th March 2019 All day
- S4 and S5 course choice parent information session 21st March 2019. 7-8.30pm
- S4 course choice day 27th March 2019 All day
- S5 course choice day 3rd April 2019 All day

#### **Number of subjects**

- S2 pupils moving into S3 will have 3 compulsory subjects (English, Maths & Languages) and 7 'free choice' subjects.
- S3 pupils moving into S4 will have 2 compulsory subjects (English & Maths) and 5 'free choice' subjects.
- S4 pupils moving into S5 will have 5 'free choice' subjects
- S5 pupils moving into S6 will select up to 4 'free choice' subjects.

## Study Leave arrangements for S4-6 pupils

You will soon receive a letter outlining the study leave arrangements for all young people doing exams in May.

- S4 and S5 pupils will begin study leave on Thursday 25th April (Higher PE and Admin pupils will begin study leave on the 23rd April)
- S6 pupils will begin study leave on the 5th April. If they wish they can attend school on the 23rd and 24th April.
- A study immersion programme will run throughout May with full day study sessions prior to every exam. The immersion timetable will be available mid March.
- All S4 pupils will receive a personalised study timetable mid March. Pupils will receive 2 days study leave for every National 5 exam they are sitting.

#### ASHES to ALLELUIA

Here we go again ... Lent. And the starting - point is ... ashes ... the reminder of the ultimate destiny of all organic matter. *Memento mori ...* 'Remember you are dust ...'

One of the most unusual qualifications I have is that of a Crematorium Technician. About 15 years ago I worked for Carlisle City Council's Bereavement Services and trained at the city's Crematorium. There's a lot of 'facts & figures' to learn and a lot of practical 'stuff' and then a day's exam to get the official qualification. As you might imagine a lot of the work Crematorium Technicians do is handling or packaging or scattering or burying ashes. Every day I was confronted several times with the reality of the certainty of 'all things ending' ... including myself. On one occasion as myself and my colleagues were standing around a coffin waiting for the signal to enter the Chapel one of them leaned across and, looking at the coffin said, in a low voice ... 'remember, Simon, your name will be there one day'. I've never forgotten that! My sister hates it when I talk about death and tells me 'you're just being morbid'. But I think that to face honestly the only certainty we have in life can help 'sharpen our senses' as to what is really important in life and motivate us to use the time we have to the full. And we can do this without fear because of the astonishing promise of Jesus: 'If anyone believes in me even though they die they will live!' Ashes to Alleluia! Lent to Easter!

In Lent we face and embrace the reality of our lives in praying (try sitting absolutely still and quiet for 5 minutes a day); we think about what really is important in life by fasting (go on ... turn that mobile phone off); we make the best of the time we have by loving charitably (but don't forget to be kind to yourself, too). Happy Lent to you all!
