Multilingual debate

On Wednesday 20th March, some of our Senior Pupils attended the annual Multilingual Debate at Heriot Watt University. The motion debated this year tied in very well with the initiative to promote health and wellbeing in Scottish schools:

"This house believes that sports should be a compulsory part of the Curriculum until young people complete their Secondary Education in order to support their physical and mental well-being."



A panel consisting of different linguists debated for or against this motion in their mother tongue. These speeches were simultaneously translated by 4th Year Students from the section of Translation and Interpretation into English but also from English to different languages. This event was attended by many other schools from all over Scotland and West Lothian was represented by our school. Darcy, Callum, Ciara, Eilidh and Kirstin, S5.

The Young Peoples Collaborative

The Young Peoples Collaborative was established at the start of this academic session and has joint together the Pupil Council and the S6 Leadership Team to promote pupil voice. The Collaborative has done some fantastic work since then including contributing to interview questions for teaching candidates, proving feedback on subjects as part of our selfevaluation, and helping us to redesign curricular areas and Pupil Support. S6 pupils in leadership posts have worked with the Pupil Council to develop initiatives such as offering translators at parent's evening and offering revision workshops to S4 pupils. A small group responded to a petition from pupils to make some changes to the uniform policy. They researched their proposal and presented it to the Leadership Team -

Presenting to the Senior Leadership Team gave me more confidence than I had before. We were very nervous to present but all the teachers were supportive and open-minded to the idea' - Ella S3. The Leadership Team were very impressed with the group's research and presentation skills - 'We got evidence from parents about the cost of a school year, evidence from pupils about the quality of school jumpers, and did some research on disposable income in West Lothian compared to the UK overall' - Abbey S3. In the pictures some members of the YPC are writing an improvement plan for the 2019/2020 session and would like to work on our Gold Rights Respecting Schools Award, improving our use of the school grounds and playing a greater role in evaluating learning and teaching.

This Lent let us intensify our prayers for Pope Francis after his sixth year anniversary in the Vatican ...

As I'm sure we all remember, on 13 March 2013, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, was elected 265th successor of St Peter and Vicar of Christ. The 76-year-old Cardinal became Pope Francis choosing the name in honour of St Francis of Assisi. He is now 82 and very often asks for our prayers for him! Why should we pray and support this Pope? Below are ten reasons that I like and want to share with you:

The first non-European Pope in more than 1,200 years and someone with an outspoken style and radically different leadership style has made Pope Francis one of the most controversial Pope's ever. His views on church reform, poverty, climate change and divorce have shaken up world opinion and placed him firmly in the media spotlight. His visits to Israel and Cuba, the welcoming of Palestine president, Mahmoud Abbas to the Vatican, his address to the U.S. Congress and willingness to meet world leaders demonstrate that he is a Pope unafraid of international diplomacy. A real leader does not shy away from crisis and debate but embraces them as part of finding a solution. Here are his views on ten key issues, in his own words:

- **1. Human Rights** "Human rights are not only violated by terrorism, repression or assassination, but also by unfair economic structures that creates huge inequalities."
- **2.** Equality "We must restore hope to young people, help the old, be open to the future, spread love. Be poor among the poor. We need to include the excluded and preach peace."
- **3. Peace** "Each of us has a vision of good and of evil. We have to encourage people to move towards what they think is good... Everyone has his own idea of good and evil and must choose to follow the good and fight evil as he conceives them. That would be enough to make the world a better place."
- **4. Finance** "There is a need for financial reform along ethical lines that would produce in its turn an economic reform to benefit everyone. This would nevertheless require a courageous change of attitude on the part of political leaders."
- **5. Work-** "Together with a culture of work, there must be a culture of leisure as gratification. To put it another way: people who work must take the time to relax, to be with their families, to enjoy themselves, read, listen to music, play a sport."
- **6. The Environment -** "May the relationship between man and nature not be driven by greed, to manipulate and exploit, but may the divine harmony between beings and creation be conserved in the logic of respect and care."
- **7. Sustainability -** "Never have we so hurt and mistreated our common home as we have in the last 200 years."
- **8. World Economy** "The idea of infinite or unlimited growth, which proves so attractive to economists, financiers and experts in technology ... is based on the lie that there is an infinite supply of the earth's goods and this leads to the planet being squeezed dry at every limit."
- **9. Government** "Every man, every woman who has to take up the service of government, must ask themselves two questions: 'Do I love my people in order to serve them better? Am I humble and do I listen to everybody, to diverse opinions in order to choose the best path?' If you don't ask those questions, your governance will not be good."
- **10. Power** "You cannot be in a position of power and destroy the life of another person."

Lord enlighten every dark spot on this earth, sustain our Pope Francis in his difficult mission and let us experience your peace in this troubled world. Amen!
