Malawi Trip 2019

On the morning of 18th of June a group of forty, made up of pupils teachers and volunteers will leave the school to begin the 6000 mile journey to Malawi. This will be the fourth trip from the school since 2013. Each time a group have worked with a small community on a building a refurbishment project. This time our group will be travelling to Ntondoko, a small village in rural Blantyre – working with the people of the village and a team of Malawian builders to refurbish two classrooms and build two new classrooms.

Over the last two years the group have been raising funds, collecting gifts and planning the trip with the Glasgow based charity "Classrooms for Malawi" and Orbis Travel.

With the support of the cluster parishes, primary schools, family and friends an amazing sum of just over £24000 has been raised to meet the cost of the materials and building cost. In addition to this, and with support from many of the same groups around 50 of our 120 suitcases we are taking are filled with gifts for those in need.

As well as doing the building work we will be making a visit to a fair trade tea plantation, an orphanage and going out on safari.

Although we go there with our gifts and support, from experience those who have travelled before know that that each member of the group will come back having received so much more in return.



RCIA introduces people into a relationship with the Lord Jesus and the Church, and helps form us as disciples of the Lord

It is not some kind of 'night class' ... but it is a weekly evening commitment (and this year will be held at St. Peter's)

There is no exam at the end ...

... but there are things called 'Scrutinies' (during Lent) which are intensely focussed prayers for those who want to become members of the Church

RCIA is not primarily about learning 'stuff' or information although a lot of time is spent looking at Biblical texts, praying, reflecting and learning all sorts of useful 'stuff' about what Catholics believe and do!

Every RCIA is a unique and wonderful experience of friendship and faith
