What is UCAS?

- UCAS is the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service.
- This body processes admissions for anyone wishing to enter Higher Education (at degree level).



Key Submission Dates

- October 15th for Veterinary and Medicine applicants. Mr Bennett and Mrs Crookston will oversee.
- All other degrees: 15th January, 2020.
- School-based dates will be earlier to enable proof reading of the Personal Statement and final Reference.



Costs

- The fee for applications is £18 for a single choice or £24 for multiple courses.
- Payments must be made directly to UCAS itself, using credit or debit card. Mrs Crookston and Mr Bennett can assist students with this part of the process.
- Students are recommended to choose the £24 option: it allows up to five different courses (at different universities) to be applied for.
- Students' Personal Statements should be tailored towards the specific courses/fields of study to which they are applying.



Students' In-School UCAS Journey

- Monday 26th August: first assembly, introducing UCAS and LEAPS.
- All of this information is now accessible on Microsoft Teams the exclusive S6 Team page.
- ▶ Thursday 5th September: second assembly, reinforcing the above and reminding students to write down their preferred course of study in order to be assigned a specialised Link Teacher.
- ► Thursday 12th September: all students will be assigned their Link Teachers.
- ► Tuesday 17th September: UCAS fayre at Ingliston from 9:30am-12:30pm. Cost £5. Please pay via iPay.
- Every \$6 assembly will have a "UCAS spot", reminding pupils of the process/timeline.



Personal Statement

- First contact: academic week beginning Wednesday 18th September. The sooner the better!
- Completed Personal Statements due no later than Friday 11th October (medics and vets aside).
- References will be completed by teachers within a week of students' completion of their Personal Statements.
- Mr Bennett and Mrs Crookston will process finalised UCAS application forms, starting the moment students and teachers have completed Personal Statements and References.



LEAPS

- What is LEAPS?
 - ► Lothians Equal Access Programme for Schools
- "LEAPS is a widening participation programme which aims to encourage and advise students who are traditionally under-represented in higher education." – LEAPS website



Eligibility Criteria

Any one (or more) of the following:

- Student who is first generation in family to apply to higher education or whose parents do not already have a degree.
- Student from a low-income background (for instance, where a student is entitled to EMA, free meals in school, or where the family is on income support).
- Student who has spent time in care or being looked after.
- Student who is a young carer by this we mean a young person who cares, unpaid, for a friend or family member who due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction.
- student who lives in one of Scotland's 20% most disadvantaged communities as defined by the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD20). You can check your postcode on the LEAPS website.

- One-to-one LEAPS interviews will take place at St Margaret's on the 8th, 9th and 10th of October.
- All LEAPS eligible pupils MUST attend.
