Subject Spotlight - Maths

The Maths Department in St. Margaret's Academy is dedicated to providing an experience to all pupils that will increase their appreciation of Mathematics whilst maximising their attainment within the subject. We do this by setting high expectations for all learners and by implementing the best, research backed, teaching techniques.

Highlights from our results this year include 78 pupils in S4 passing National 5 Maths (our 2nd highest total ever), over 100 pupils entering S6 with National 5 Maths (a new record) and 49 pupils passing Higher Maths in S5 (another record). These results allow our pupils opportunities to access a greater number of career opportunities in the future.

Jupiter Artland - S2 Art & Design workshop

This week S2 pupils took part in a sculpture workshop led by staff from Jupiter Artland's learning programme. Groups were given key words such as Up, Wrap and Walk to inspire the creation of their sculptures, which utilised different materials such as wooden planks, wire, sticks and stones. Furthermore, pupils were able to actively build and adapt their design, and ultimately observe the vastly different outcomes achieved from the same basic materials.

The second half of the workshop involved creative and critical thinking where pupils distilled their ideas down into a proposal; a process used by professional artists and designers. The value of the workshop was evident in the students enthusiastic feedback; "I learned that you can make art out of anything around you" and, "I learned that mistakes can lead to a better idea". Fixperts integrates design & technology, engineering thinking and practical making skills and allows students to develop their creative skills through hands on model making whilst learning to improve their ideas through feedback. Most importantly students develop their creative problem solving skills through identifying, analysing and experiencing real problems seen in the world

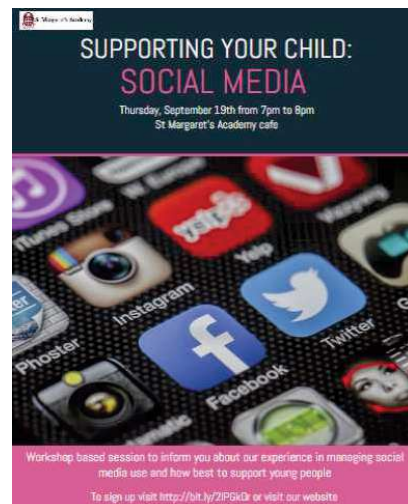



Update on Fr Kenneth: Fr Kenneth is now walking without sticks and is getting out and about every day. He's making good progress.

Aged & Infirm Clergy Fund Second Collection: A second collection will be taken this weekend, 14 & 15 September (apart from St Peter's when it will be next weekend). This fund provides the living costs and housing for our retired priests and is one of the main sources of income for the fund. Our priests retire at age 75 so they work longer than most other occupations. We all have a joint commitment to support them as they reach old age and are no longer supported by an individual parish. Thank you for your generosity.

SSVP Appeal: The four parish groups are making an appeal for assistance to help a young family in the town who are about to be made homeless (mum, dad and three young children). The family were brought to our attention via a local Foodbank and we are now in the fortunate position, thanks to a family in our parish, of being able to offer them alternative accommodation. As this new accommodation is unfurnished, we need to help them furnish it. Therefore, we will be 'standing down' our collection today, Sunday 15th, which means all money collected will not be banked but put towards furnishing the accommodation. Please be as generous as you can. Thank you.

A new model for Inter-Religious Dialogue in the Service of Peace

Discussing core issues of the conflict

This is based on the fundamental axiom that the absence of violence does not mean there is peace; that there is passive aggression lingering in the minds of people. And so what this point seeks to reiterate is that the conflict can and should be discussed in an OPEN, HONEST, FRANK AND FORTHRIGHT fashion guided by consistent and professional facilitators without creating animosity or antagonism (here it does not help by scratching the surface of the conflict). The process seeks to make participants know that:

- the discussion is painful and difficult but at the same time has healing effects;
- that it is meaningful and enriching as significant levels of trust have been built;
- it brings about/leads to deep mutual understanding of the others religious cultural and existential reality even if it delineates where people fundamentally do not and often cannot agree with each other.

Taking action separately and together as individuals

- Sharing of experiences whichever way is possible and simple human gestures like visiting the sick or bereaved, reconciliation etc.
- Sharing meals during religious festivals, attending weddings and naming ceremonies etc.

As groups

Taking common action on environmental issues, human rights, justice and peace matters, issues on morality that effect the society in general (eg. drug addiction, teenage pregnancies, etc).

In the inter-religious peace building programmes and initiatives each person/group becomes a '*multiplier*' who can spread the message of the possibilities and benefits of peaceful co-existence and the method of dialogue and education to many other people in his/her society.

WIADOMOŚCI POLSKIEJ WSPÓLNOTY W LIVINSTON



Niedzielną Liturgię słowa możemy śmiało określić mianem „Liturgii miłosierdzia”. Zaczynając od pierwszego czytania aż po ostatnie słowa Ewangelii słyszymy niezwykle apel Boga skierowany ku człowiekowi. Na czym polega główna treść tego apelu? Rzecz jasna, w jego centrum znajduje się wątek miłosierdzia.

Trzeba nam dzisiaj dobrze zrozumieć znaczenie tego słowa. Spójrzmy na przypowieść o miłosiernym ojcu, którą często nazywają również przypowieścią o marnotrawnym synu. Nie przez przypadek podałem dwa tytuły tej samej przypowieści, ponieważ poprzez zestawienie jednego z drugim jeszcze lepiej, jeszcze głębiej zanurzymy się w całym bogactwie treści Ewangelii.

Zastanówmy się nad postawą syna, który roztrwonił część majątku swego ojca. Co jego skłania, aby powrócić? Czy tylko głód i niedostatek? Przyczyna jest głębsza. Ten człowiek roztrwonił nie tylko majątek ojca, lecz także swoją tożsamość. Będąc w rozpacz usilnie szuka wyjścia i niby znajduje, ponieważ mówi: „Ojcze zgrzeszyłem przeciw Bogu i względem ciebie, już nie jestem godzien nazywać się twoim synem: uczyni mnie choćby jednym z najemników” (Łk 15, 18n). Gdzieś podskórnie odczuwa, że po tym co uczynił już nie może być synem, lecz chce zostać niewolnikiem swego ojca. Przychodzi do niego, aby przedstawić swoją decyzję.

Jednak reakcja ojca na propozycję syna była zupełnie nieoczekiwana: zamiast tego, aby jeszcze bardziej potłuc tożsamość swego syna, czyniąc go niewolnikiem, ojciec ją skleja i ozdabia. A zatem miłosierdzie Boga względem nas polega na przywróceniu utraconej tożsamości dzieci Bożych, a sakrament spowiedzi jest najlepszym sposobem, aby tę tożsamość na nowo odzyskać.
