Lost Property


Please be reminded that the lost property basket is located outside the Janitors Office. If you have lost any items of clothing etc. please check this basket in the first instance.





My recent experience of Scotland

Hello. My name is Maksim and I'm a seminarian at the Seminary of the Society of Catholic Apostolate (Fr Piotr's Order). It's a pleasure for me to share with you a short story about my recent experience of studying English in Edinburgh and about my experience of vocation.

These past three weeks of studying English has been a great experience and I've also learnt more about Scottish culture, traditions and history. It's my second time in Scotland because last year I had an opportunity to visit the country with other seminarians from Poland. That was my first experience of speaking English. A new country, new people, new culture interested me. It is a challenge: exploring something that I had heard about from other people, read in books or watched in films.

This year's course in ECS Scotland (the name of the school) concentrated on speaking and listening skills so I was really happy to speak with other students from different countries and of course with native speakers. During coffee break, I shared with other students my feelings about the things we had been looking at in classes and received feedback from teachers so it was very helpful.

Three weeks in Scotland have flown by and now I've to go back to my seminary in Poland. Soon I'll go on retreat to prepare for the next step of formation and then a new academic year! Actually, I'm in the 4th year of theological studies and, if everything goes as I hope it will, I'll be ordained to the priesthood in 2022. So, for now, I ask you to pray for me and all seminarians because each vocation is unique and we need your prayers. When we pray it helps other people find this particular way of life. The first steps were difficult, but over time I discovered if I pray, something changes inside myself and takes on specific shapes. It's a necessary part of my vocation: to give God space where He can do and change things.

I would like to thank everyone who organised my stay in Scotland. Special thanks to Fr Kenneth, Fr Simon and Fr Piotr. I thank all whom I've met in Scotland for welcoming me. WIADOMOŚCI POLSKIEJ WSPÓLNOTY W LIVINSTON

Nie możecie służyć Bogu i mamonie! Tak brzmi podsumowanie niedzielnej Liturgii słowa. Czy to nam wystarczy? Czy nie rodzą się w nas pytania typu "dlaczego?" oraz "jak to rozumieć?".

W pierwszym czytaniu, z księgi proroka Amosa, akcent pada na tę grupę ludzi, która za własne 'credo' wybrała hasło "cel uświęca środki". Nic nowego pod słońcem, jak mawiał Kohelet. Spójrzmy na dzisiejsze realia, czy historia z pierwszego czytania nie rozgrywa się na naszych oczach ?! Zmieniała się tylko zewnętrzna strona, sedno sprawy pozostało prawie nienaruszone.

Słowa z Listu św. Pawła do Tymoteusza mogą nas nieco zaskakiwać, ponieważ Apostoł narodów zaleca przede wszystkim modlić się za królów i sprawujących władzę. Czyżby nieustraszony głosiciel mądrości krzyża miał jakieś obawy? Czy brakuje mu ufności w Bożą Opatrzność ? Spójrzmy na intencję św. Pawła, który pragnie prowadzić życie spokojne, godne i pobożne. Nie lęk, lecz troska. Nie obawy, lecz trzeźwe myślenie Apostoła pozwala prawidłowo spojrzeć na jego modlitewne motywacje.

Szczytem Liturgii słowa jest Ewangelia, gdzie możemy odnaleźć kwintesencję dzisiejszego słowa Bożego. To nie tylko przypowieść o nieuczciwym zarządcy, lecz także o podzielonym sercu. W naszej codzienności dość często staramy się odnaleźć optymalne rozwiązania, potrzebie zachowywania harmonii, niekiedy mówimy o złotym środku, tzw. sztuce zachowania umiaru. Zobaczmy, że ta sztuka nie ma nic wspólnego z podzielonym sercem, które z jednej strony niby chce służyć Bogu, ale nie omieszka również przylgnąć do "mamony". Chrystus w dzisiejszej Ewangelii wskazuje nam kierunek, który należy wybrać i właśnie w tym nurcie zachowywać umiar, nie zaś nieumiarkowanie.
