30th Sunday of the Year - Year C



The familiar words of the Magnificat: "He has pulled down princes from their thrones and raised high the lowly" introduces a theme that is important to Luke ie. that God reverses the fortunes of the poor.

This theme is found again in today's gospel where we hear the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. As in many good stories exaggeration is used for effect while the Pharisee expounds his own

virtue the tax collector (who would be considered an outcast as he is someone who liaises with gentiles and works alongside the foreign occupying power with their host of pagan gods) prays for mercy with humility.

Most of us have in us a bit of both the tax collector and the Pharisee. The Pharisee is not a bad guy, he upholds the law of Moses given to the people of God in the desert, he is a good observant religious person who prays, teaches, gathers for worship etc. However his pious practises separate him from other people. His judgemental and closed attitudes mean he cannot be in communion with God and with others.

On the other hand the tax collector focuses not on himself but on God and God's grace and mercy. God's mercy cannot be earned it is given to us as a free gift so that we can grow both in the love of God and of each other.
